



NAYARA HANGAROA

Easter Island, Chile

An ancient land, a unique culture, an extraordinary experience

Location

Nayara Hangaroa is located in a privileged place within Easter Island, on the main waterfront of the town with sea views, less than 1 kilometer from the airport and steps from the town center, which allows travelers to easily immerse themselves into the local community. To travel to Easter Island it is important to consider that it is located more than 3,000 kilometers from Chile.

Inspiration

The architectural conception of Nayara Hangaroa constitutes a tribute to the ceremonial village of Orongo, whose remains are still found on the heights of the Rano Kau volcano, in its west summit. Our green roof resemble the roofs of this village and the buildings are connected through gardens.

The colors and textures of our rooms blend with the environment and pay tribute to this mysterious and ancient culture.

How to get there

From outside Chile, you must fly to Santiago, and take a connecting flight to Easter Island (Rapa Nui). Travel time is approximately 5 hours. Mataverí airport is located a few minutes from the hotel and transfers can be coordinated with our team.

Manavai Spa

With four treatment rooms, sauna and jacuzzi, the Spa Manavai is a replica of an ancient Manavai, a low rock which was used to protect crops from wind and water. Surrounded by white sand and overlooking the Pacific Ocean, the spa offers relaxation treatments, exfoliation, seaweed coverage, chocolate, body and facial cleansing.

We have 75 rooms built with natural materials, such as logs, clay and volcanic stone, thus offering an immersion in the Rapa Nui habitat. All the rooms are equipped with state-of-the-art technology that control water and electricity consumption, in addition to minimizing noise and maintaining the temperature according to the preference of each guest. The rooms have a spectacular private terrace with a privileged view of the sea whose horizon has no end, surrounded by the immense Pacific Ocean, far from everything, in the center of the world: Te Pito o Te Henua.

KAINGA: Kainga means earth. In its decoration, the local culture and the unique geography of the island blend. Windows from floor to roof let in lots of light and allow panoramic views of the ocean. The room is large and the columns are natural cypress trunks. The sink is handmade from volcanic stone and on the terrace you can hear the sound of the waves hitting the rocks. The presence of noble elements and unique views immerses you in the culture

MA'UNGA: The Ma'unga room means mountain in the Rapa Nui language. Built on two levels, it is the perfect space for a family. The open floor concept and the bay windows from floor to ceiling give a lot of clarity and grant wide views from the ocean. The private terrace allows you to appreciate the beauty of the island and listen to the captivating sound of the sea.

Food

Nayara Hangaroa offers indigenous cuisine that merges international specialties with the traditional culinary delights of the Rapa Nui.

A festival of flavors is what you can find in our Kaloa, Poevara Restaurants and Vaikoa Bar. Each of them it is characterized by its variety of options and an ideal environment to enjoy good food.

Event Rooms

An ideal environment for concentration and renewing energies is the perfect frame for an event or corporate meeting. In Nayara Hangaroa we have an auditorium with capacity for more than 300 people, both for conferences or even Polynesian dance shows. In addition, we have smaller meeting rooms for reduced events or workgroups. After the business meetings, the participants can enjoy the landscapes of Easter Island and the first class gastronomy offered by our restaurants Poevara, Kaloa and Vaikoa Bar.



ARCHEOLOGY AND HERITAGE

The gigantic stone statues, the Moai, are the most singular and iconic elements of the Rapa Nui's culture. Today, the island is considered "A Wonder of the World" and "Heritage of the Humanity" by UNESCO: a reflection of the wonder and curiosity that the island awakens in all visitors. Nobody knows how statues were sculpted, but they testify of the courage, ingenuity and determination of the human spirit. It is believed that each Moai represents a leader or a beloved ancestor. Until today, the faces of the statues are called "Aringa Ora", which translates as "alive faces of beloved and revered ancestors"
