BULLO RIVER STATION

Driving into Bullo River Station is an adventure in itself, and if you follow our guide, you'll have a safe drive in and out. This map will also help orientate you as you approach the Homestead.

To drive in you'll need a 4WD, a full tank of fuel from Kununurra or Timber Creek, and we recommend you have plenty of water with you.

There's a couple of 'rules' we need you to follow;

- Please call us on 08 9168 7375 when you leave town. We will calculate your arrival time and send out the search party if you don't arrive. There is no mobile phone reception so we can't stress how important it is that we know when you're on your way.
- Please stick to the road. Don't go off on any tracks or stop for a hike. Remember, we're watching the clock for your arrival.
- Time your arrival to drive during day light hours. It's worth seeing the property and there is more animal activity from dusk. Allow two hours from the highway turn off.
- Take it slow. While we have a grader on site and do our best to keep the road in good condition, the harsh environment takes its toll very quickly. The wet season causes the driveway to flood and turn muddy. In the dry season, the bulldust, a very fine powdery dust, accumulates quickly which can bog or cause cars to slide.

In addition to the road conditions, there is always wildlife along the way. It is not unusual to have to slow down or stop for buffalo, cattle, wild donkeys, wallabies and other animals.

You'll quickly see there is a lot of bulldust on our road. The trick in keeping dust on the outside of your car is to pressurise your car using your air conditioning settings. Keep your windows up and set your air conditioning settings so that you have fresh air coming in (not recirculating) with the fan on a higher setting. This means you have air being pumped in, which then gets pushed out through your car seals - which means dust can't get in.

When you come up to a gate, wait for the dust to settle before you open your door.

If a gate is open, it can stay open but if a gate is closed, please close it again after you have driven through.

Remember, if you get into any trouble, don't leave your car. We will find you.
